
# THE PRI8M TAROT

I cut this stone with all of you in mind.

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
### Introduction

A PRISM bends white light into a full spectrum of colors. In a similar fashion, looking through the prism of the tarot can help us see the true colors and many facets within ourselves. That is the core concept this deck seeks to explore.

My goal in illustrating this deck was to create a gentle, dreamlike vision of the universe that would promote a sense of comfort and ease. Though the images are primarily composed of light and color, I wanted to be faithful to the energy of the cards and honor the duality of light and dark in my own way. It is not meant to sugar coat things, but to be a guiding light for navigating the darker aspects of the subconscious, illuminating the truth, and confronting the harshness of reality.

The deck itself is multifaceted and can be used as a tool for divination, self-reflection, sparking creativity, meditation, or play. Whether you're an avid tarot reader or supporter of the arts, I hope you can connect to my work in your own unique way. - L.L.

Each card has a different combination of these symbols depending on their unique astrological, planetary, and elemental correspondence. They all have the sigil I created with my intention for the deck, which may appear in various locations.

### Color

Color plays a large role in the design and use of this deck. Aside from being a visual representation of the prism concept, the 7 colors each have individual meaning based on the energetic gears of the body, or chakras.

Red/Pink - Root Chakra energy. Grounding. Focus. Support.

Orange - Sacral Chakra energy. Creativity. Identity. Pleasure. Passion. Desire. Inspiration.

Yellow - Solar Plexus Chakra energy. Instinct. Wisdom. Confidence.

Green - Heart Chakra Energy. Love. Compassion. Emotion.

Blue - Throat Chakra Energy. Truth. Clarity. Communication.

Purple - Third Eye Chakra Energy. Intuition. Spirituality. Psychic energy.

White - Crown Chakra Energy. Enlightenment. Purity. Universal connection.

#### The Minor Arcana

The minor arcana is separated into four suits: Wands, Cups, Swords, and Pentacles. Those suits each consist of ten pip cards and four court cards.

Each suit exists within its own world and tells its own universal story, much like the Fool's journey present in the Major Arcana. They each deal with different aspects of the human psyche.

The energy of the minor arcana is more focused on the individual rather than the bigger picture. In readings, these cards often relate to aspects of our everyday lives, personality, and temporary circumstances.

After familiarizing yourself with the energy of each suit, you can combine that knowledge with what you now know about numerology, as well as their visual symbolism, to easily intuit the meaning of each numbered card.

For example, Cups relates to emotions and the number 5 relates to reversals of fortune and strife, so you can assume the V of Cups has something to do with emotional turmoil and loss. Of course, it also depends on the context of the reading and what your intution tells you.

### The Royal Court

Four court cards crown each suit of the minor arcana. These are the cards we are most able to identify with because they represent familiar human personality archetypes. As such, they are sometimes pulled from the deck as querent significators before a reading begins.

If they appear in a reading they are often representative of people in our lives or ourselves. They may also indicate the querent's current relationship to the personality of that card and suggest that they either are embodying that energy or denying that part of themselves.

Unlike all the other numbered cards in the deck, they are each indicated by the elemental energy they possess and introduce to their suit.

Though certain cards are associated with masculine and feminine energy, I want to point out that those energies exist within all of us regardless of gender identity. It is a core duality present in Tarot like light and dark. In order to make the deck more inclusive, I've given the court both traditional and gender neutral titles.

KNIGHTS OR MESSENGERS are the spirit of fire and fathers of the court. They possess the seed of creation and represent the raw power of their suit. They are passionate, swift, inspired, and violent. The waxing crescent moon represents their latent power. They relate to goals, decisions, rapid action, and messages.



QUEENS OR CULTIVATORS are the spirit of water and mothers of the court. They represent the nurtured power of their suit. They are nurturing, grounded, creative, and receptive. The half moon represents their half-fulfilled potential. They relate to confidence, independence, inner strength, and intuition.

KINGS OR RULERS are the spirit of air and sons of the court. They represent the mastered and balanced power of their suit. They are sincere, compassionate, wise, and just. The waxing gibbous moon represents their nearly realized power. They relate to communication, personal values, advice, and leadership.



PRINCESSES OR TRANSFORMERS are the spirit of earth and daughters of the court. They serve as the vessel, inheritor, and guardian of the elemental energy that was born from the ace. They represent the transformed, purified, and fully expressed power of their suit. The full moon represents their fully realized power. They relate to growth, aspirations, and the human condition.

Aces are the spark of potential for the suit, and princesses are that potential fulfilled.



THE SUIT OF WANDS rules over will, inspiration, passion, and motivation. It speaks to our desire for connection, expansion, and power. In a reading, Wands will often appear when exploring matters of influence, creativity, and achievement.

Upon returning to their kingdom, they are given a hero's welcome. They bask in the happy, peaceful feeling of coming home. However, the new power and expanded perspective they acquired on their journey is threatening to some. Rivals appear to challenge them in a clash of ideas and points of view.

#### VI

With powerful will and an open mind, they emerge victorious. The community continues to publicly celebrate their achievements.

#### VII


Resentment continues to build until what was once a friendly rivalry becomes an all out war for control. They go on the defensive in order to protect themselves and their status.

They see an opening to escape and soar higher, further, and faster into the sky, but danger still looms close behind. They take temporary refuge in in the clouds, but with the permanent target on their back the battle is never-ending. Their power begins to fade, but they are determined to continue the fight.

In the end, the weight of their power and responsibility proves to be too heavy a burden. Even as they plummet from the sky, they are still unwilling to let go.

Before they realize it they are alone again, left to mourn over everything they lost, and unable to see past their all-consuming grief. However, a spark of hope from the past reminds them that happiness is attainable if they choose to seek it out and remain true to themselves.





True mental clarity can only be found by letting go of emotional attachments. It is a hard lesson to learn, but heartache imparts the wisdom that can only be found in suffering. They allow themselves to mourn, then move on.

#### IV

The mental toll of the first two trials forces them to take a moment's rest. They use the time to recuperate and recenter so they can be ready for the challenges that still lie ahead. They push forward with renewed vigor to overcome trial after trial. Without emotional attachments to hold them back, they take out anything and anyone in their way without remorse. When finally they stand victorious at the apex, they realize that the price of **their triumph** was a part of their own humanity.

Upon the solemn realization that there is nothing left for them where they are, they decide to begin a new journey towards a fresh start. They strive to release their baggage along the way, but it still weighs heavily upon them.

#### VII





## THE MAJOR ARCANA

The major arcana tells the story of the Fool's journey of redemption to enlightenment. As in life, there are many ups and downs along the way.

The Fool travels down 21 paths on their journey, and those paths can be further broken down into three arcs. The first arc from The Magician to The Chariot represents outer triumph, the second arc from Strength to Temperance represents inner triumph, and the third arc from The Devil to The Universe represents triumph over both the inner and outer worlds (or the conscious and subconscious) and the successful blending of the two, resulting in a perfect state of cosmic consciousness.

When major arcana cards appear in a reading, they suggest that there may be powerful forces at work creating circumstances that are outside of your control. Just as they represent points on The Fool's journey, they represent turning points in your own life that may be life altering. They serve as messages, guidance, and warnings to you from the universe.

#### The Fool

Only a fool would try to fly before their wings have time to grow and venture forth in blindness from the comfort of above for the inevitable chaos of below.

But if you don't take the leap, you'll never know.



Upright: New beginnings. Infinite potential. Courage to take a leap of faith. Innocence.

Reversed: Naivety. Blind faith. Reckless actions.

## The Magician

The fall created a bridge between worlds and illuminated the infinite connection between body, mind, heart, and soul. Thus the universal truth of as above, so below.

A true magus needs only the courage to speak their desire and the will to make it so.



Upright: Manifestation of desire. Willpower. Tools for success. Focus. Acting on intention.

Reversed: Latent talents. Mental fog. Hidden potential. Misuse of power. Manipulation.

The guardian of the divine feminine waits patiently between the twin pillars of duality for one who is worthy to peak beyond the veil and unlock the sacred knowledge they've waited lifetimes to share.



Upright: Heightened intuitive potential. Duality. Listen to your inner wisdom. Embrace your divine feminine energy. Subconscious desires.

Reversed: Lack of faith in your intuition. Shutting out your inner voice. Denial of the divine feminine. Secrets. Lies. Hidden agendas.

# III The Empress

The Empress descends to gently dip their feet into the stream of consciousness forming a connection that sends ripples throughout the universe.

The cypress trees who once laid down their branches for Venus grow tall and lush once again for the one who holds Earth and the power of creation in their hands.



Upright: Femininity. Connection to Earth. Abundance. Maternal energy. Giving birth to life or new ideas.

Upright: Embrace tradition. Established values and beliefs. Community. Collective Wisdom. Spiritual leader. Divine masculine energy.

Sometimes we need some distance to reflect on icy mountains and dazzling auroras, to cradle ourselves in the egg of the cosmos until we can be reborn in the light of wisdom.



Upright: Gazing inward. Soul searching. Retreating from the material. Introspection. Being a guiding light.

Reversed: Isolation. Overthinking. Withdrawal. Disconnection. Taking time for yourself.



#### The Wheel of Fortune

From beyond the light a vision appears of the living mechanism whose perpetual motion brings about the turns of fate. Its prophecy reveals moments of triumph that usher us towards destruction and back again, the chaos within the cosmos, and the intricate connection of all things. It calls upon us to accept our destiny and toke the wheel



Upright: Upward reversal of fortune. Turning points. Inevitability. Destiny. Trust the universe. Karma. Vision Enlightenment. Universal connection.

Reversed: Downward reversal of fortune. Resistance to change. Negative cycles. Regaining control.

#### Justice

The double-edged blade of truth rests, sheathed within the throat of Justice. They perform a balancing act, a display of faith and focus, a protest for fairness, with awareness of the potential price of their valiance. With one hand on mercy and the other on severity they bridge the gap with mildness and cannot be moved.

The cosmic hourglass exists at once full of promise and devoid of mercy. Like the wheel, it is turned ceaselessly by the hands of fate.

Inevitable endings plant the seeds for beautiful beginnings. We were born to transform, decompose down to bare bones then start again.

Upright: Inevitability. Transformation. Rebirth. Transitions. Change. Letting go of old attachments.

Reversed: Resistance to change. Intense personal transformation. Fear of the inevitable.



### Temperance

Imagine, fire and water meeting without destroying each other, but instead harmonizing to become something powerful and new.

Imagine, the same convergence happening to reconcile the wild elements inside of you.

Imagine, the serenity of feeling everything in balance, removing your shackles to the material and being the light that exists peacefully within darkness.

Imagine, that golden crown you've always reached for being placed gently on your head by your highest self.



Upright: Connection to your highest self. The middle path. Patience. Idealism. Being in alignment with your life's purpose. Harmony. Balance. Positive energy. Moderation.

Reversed: Straying from your path. Living in excess. Imbalance. Negativity. Misaligned actions and values.



In this shadow theater of fools the Devil whispers sweet lies with every string that they tie, then makes you play the part of Pied Piper in a tale of your own demise.

Your demons know the selfish desires you hide and tell you they're just sublime. The indulgence feels so good, you believe them every time.

But can you also feel the burning sting of salty tears on the freshly cut slit in your tongue?

Reversed: Narrow avoidance of disaster. Living dangerously. Existential crisis. Resistance to accepting the truth or change.

## XVII The Star

The birth of a star is often violent, its life marked by brilliance, its end barely noticed, but there's still hope in its existence.

The charioteer who once dashed across the starry sky with haste and hubris was thrown from their carriage, and when they got back up again had a sudden longing for stillness.

Feel the ground reach up to meet you. Meditate on the serenity that exists between the light and dark aspects of you.

Close your eyes to see the stars realign within you. Then, with renewed faith in your power ride again.

Aquarius

Upright: Hope. Faith. Meditation. Coming into your power. Focusing on the future. Determination. Renewal.

Reversed: A test of faith. Feeling hopeless. Despair. Spiritually drained. Lacking motivation.

## X∨III The Moon

Lulled by sweet serenity the sound of gentle waves calls you to rest, but don't be fooled it's yet another test.

In your slumber you find yourself on a moonlit shore by the primordial waters where illusions and nightmares are born.

The path to morning is long and winding, each misstep a promise of being lost forever in endless depths.

When your untamed spirit comes out to play your intuition can keep you safe if you listen very closely and let it lead the way.



Upright: Subconscious messages. Trauma. Illusions. Anxiety. Dreams. Shadow self. Lunar influence. Uncertainty. Listen to your intuition.

Reversed: Repressed shadow self, desires, or emotions. Confusion. Unclear messages. Clouded intuition. Overcoming trauma, illusions, and anxiety.

## XIX The Sun

They say the Sun is also a star, but to those on Earth it is so much more. Its light and warmth are close enough to reach out and feel. It is the monarch of the morning, and the herald of a new day. It ignites a once empty horizon, and calls you to wake up so you too can rise and set the world on fire.



Upright: Radiant energy. Vitality. Optimism. Youthful exuberance. Enlightenment.

Reversed: Disconnected from your inner child. Struggling to see the bright side. Overconfidence. Naivety



### Judgement

The call of Gabriel's horn radiates seven sounds of sorrow, the notes flow into a rapturous crescendo that wakes the dead.

Once wayward souls emerge from their sullen graves who in life, through strife and suffering, saw the truth behind the veil, now rise gladly towards their final judgement ready to be born again.



Upright: Call to action. Atonement. Life-altering decisions. Forgiveness. Leaving the past behind. Redemption.

Reversed: Ignoring the call. Regret. Shame. Fear. Holding onto the past.

## XXI The Universe

You've come so far to see yourself as you were meant to be and take your place at the center of the cosmos, but it is a Fool's errand to seek the ending to an endless sea.

You are infinite like the universe that surrounds you, full of stars and swirling galaxies, constantly expanding and exploding, only to begin again.

# わ Saturn

Upright: Ultimate achievement. Balance of mind, body and spirit. World Travel. Celebration. Fullfilment of your destiny. Infinite regeneration. Retrospection.

Reversed: Closing in on your goals. Not quite ready to cross the finish line. Something missing. Personal closure.

### The Prism and the Void

I included two bonus cards, The Prism and The Void, to expand upon the message and theme of the deck. They add another core duality to explore: clarity and obscurity. More specifically, they relate to the present state of mind of the reader or querent and how accurate and effective the reading may be at the current moment in time.

Sometimes your mind is clear and open to the messages the cards have for you, and sometimes it just isn't. You may not always be conscious of this, but it's something you know intuitively. I think it's an important part of the process to be able to acknowledge that.

If you prefer to read with only the traditional 78 cards, that's perfectly fine, too. I want the experience to be your own.

### The Prism

The cosmic prism absorbs infinite light through 22 facets that bend it into the colors that paint the galaxy and reveal the truth in all things.

A seven-sided prism refracts light into seven rainbows. It has three sets of seven facets that represent the three arcs on the fool's journey, plus the largest seven-sided facet on its face for a total of 22. Seven is the number of perfection, eternity, and divinity. The seven colors also relate to the chakras.

This card fully embodies the theme of revealing one's true self that The Prism Tarot seeks to explore.

In a reading, The Prism indicates that your intuition and intentions are in alignment so the message of the cards can come through crystal clear. You can trust that your reading will be accurate. In the abstract, it represents truth, light, and inner joy. It suggests that there are many possibilities on the horizon, but you are focused and able to make clear judgments.

It will also appear when you are able to embrace your true colors and are on the right path to becoming your highest self. Share the full spectrum of your personality with the world.

The reversed may suggest that your inner world is in alignment and you are ready to share your light with others. You may not feel ready yet, but this is the sign you've been waiting for. Don't be afraid to be authentically yourself. On the flip side, it could mean that you are too absorbed in the light and are denying the dark side, or your own shadow side. Beware of toxic positivity and extremes. It cautions against becoming distracted or overwhelmed by the many possibilities before you, or focusing only on what you want to see. Are you allowing vourself to be blinded by the light? Don't forget that light and shadow must both exist in harmony.

### The Void

I paint galaxies to calm my weary mind. I imagine floating breathless feeling weightless embraced by blankets of light colors I've never seen before cold and warm at the same time then darkness, silence, nothing.

But great things are born from nothing. Everything begins and ends with the void.

The void is the darkness that lies at the center of the universe. It is the source of all destruction as well as creation.

In a reading, this card indicates that you should probably put the cards away for now. You may not be in the right headspace to receive a clear message. It may represent empty feelings, intentions, or sentiments. There may be a lack of fulfillment or owareness in your life and therefore you are not asking the right questions.

But it can also be symbolic of a new opportunity. You may be on the verge of a big bang moment, something that can alter your reality and change the course of your life. It urges you to embrace your shadow self, if you aren't doing so already, in order to fully accept who you are and allow your light to shine through.

The reversed may indicate a blatant disregard for your shadow self that is holding you back from your true potential. You may feel as if there is a black hole inside of you, sucking all the joy from your life. Avoid catastrophic thinking, also known as the call of the void, or l'appel du vide in French. You may be acting soullessly or against yourself, doing things that feel like self-betraval or self-sabotaae. Act according to your true feelings. There is a void inside you that needs to be filled, and that can only be accomplished by embracing all that you are. Embrace both your light and vour dark. Avoid extremes.

### The Tree of Life

The Tree of Life is an ancient diagram of human consciousness with roots in Jewish mysticism and Kabbalah. In Tarot, The Tree of Life serves as the blueprint to the meanings of the cards and how they are connected. Conversely, the cards are considered to be the keys to the Tree of Life. For this reason, much deeper meaning can be found in the cards when their position on the tree of life is considered.

It is a very complex subject that I invite you to explore further. The following pages will serve as a broad breakdown of the companion diagram I created to expand your experience with the cards.

#### The 3 Pillars

The balance of opposites is a recurring theme in the symbolism of the cards, specifically in The High Priestess, The Hierophant, Justice, and The Chariot. In each, there is a purposeful representation of three pillars—light, dark, and neutral. On the left is Boaz, the pillar of severity and the feminine principle, on the right is Jachin, the pillar of mercy and the masculine principle, and in the center lies the pillar of mildness which serves as the keystone between them.

The position of the cards on the pillars determines the polarity of their energy. This is the reason that some cards can feel more inherently negative or positive than others.

#### The Lightning Flash

In nature, the polarity between positive and negative forces creates electricity, and it does the same here. This lightning flash is one of divine energy sent down to earth. It creates the path of enlightenment. It can also be thought of as the path from creative energy to manifestation in terms of magic.

#### The 10 Sephiroth

Along the path of the lightning flash are ten nodes called sephiroth. They are orbs of divine emanation that represent ten states of consciousness. This is the origin of the numerological meaning of the cards of the minor arcana.

I. Kether, or The Crown rests at the top of the tree with one half dipped into humanity and the other still resting in divinity. It is the connection between those two worlds and the root of consciousness. Like the Aces it is pure, infinite energy.

II. Chockmah, or Wisdom rests on the top of the right pillar and represents pure positive masculine energy. It possesses the will to create. In addition to the twos of the minor arcana, Knights are also associated to this sephirah. They are the fathers.

III. Binah, or Understanding rests on the top of the left pillar and represents pure negative feminine energy. It nurtures and gives form to the creative energy established in Chockmah. In addition to the threes of the minor arcana, Queens are also associated with this sephirah. They are the mothers. IV. Chesed, or Mercy possesses the spirit of benevolence. The fours of the minor arcana are attributed to this sephirah.

V. Geburah, or Severity possesses the spirit of judgement. The fives of the minor arcana are associated with this sephirah.

VI. Tiphereth, or Harmony corresponds to the ego and the heart and possesses the spirit of mediation. In addition to the sixes of the minor arcana, Kings are also associated to this sephirah. They are the sons of the Knights and Queens.

VII. Netzach, or Triumph possesses the energy of the emotions and the artist. The sevens of the minor arcana are associated with this sephirah.

VIII. Hod, or Glory possesses the energy of the intellect and the scientist. The eights of the minor arcana are associated with this sephirah.

IX. Yesod, or Foundation receives and purifies the energy from all the other sephiroth before transmitting it to the

physical plane. The nines of the minor arcana are associated with this sephirah.

X. Malkuth, or The Kingdom represents stability and the physical world. In addition to the tens of the minor arcana, Princesses are attributed to this sephirah. They are the daughters of the Knights and Queens.

#### The 7 Levels

There are 7 levels on the path of enlightenment that correlate to the 7 chakras. To determine which cards correspond to each chakra you just have to consider their position on the tree.

Aces = Crown Twos and Threes = Third Eye Fours and Fives = Throat Sixes = Heart Sevens and Eights = Solar Plexus Nines = Sacral Tens = Root There are 22 paths that connect the sephiroth. These paths are the origin of the major arcana. The energy of those cards is created by the flow of energy between their two connecting sephiroth. So, while they fully embody their own numerological correspondence, deeper meaning can be found if you look at them this way too.

For example, Strength is the path between Chesed (mercy) and Geburah (severity). With that in mind, it makes sense that Strength would represent gentle persuasion and understanding.

#### The 4 Worlds

The tree of life exists simultaneously within four different worlds. This is what accounts for the four suits of the minor arcana. The stories that unfold within the minor arcana can be thought of as the same journey occurring in four different realities.

Atziluth - The world of Emanation. Corresponds to fire and the suit of Wands. Briah - The world of Creation. Corresponds to water and the suit of Cups.

Yetzirah - The world of Formation. Corresponds to air and the suit of Swords.

Assiah - The world of Manifestation. Corresponds to earth and the suit of Pentacles.

#### The Serpent

Just as the lightning flash represented the descent of divine energy to earth, the serpent represents the ascent. It climbs the 22 paths on the journey of redemption told by the major arcana.

The Tree of Life serves as a reminder that there is nothing arbitrary about the symbolism of the Tarot. It rose from the ancient depths of human consciousness and will continue to be relevant throughout the reign of humanity. The cards connect us to the **past**, present, and future, as well as to the universe, ourselves, and each other.

### The Astral Calendar

I created the Astral Calendar to use as a reference for the connections between the cards and astrology.

In the center is the wheel of the year. The innermost ring shows the modality (fixed, mutable, or cardinal) and elemental correspondence for each of the 12 zodiac signs. The next ring outlines each sign's ruling planet(s) and major arcana card. The signs are then broken down into 3 decans, each of which have their own ruling planet and minor arcana card. Each of those cards is assigned to one of the 7 ancient planets. Each Knight, Queen and King rules over 3 decans of the zodiac. Each Princess rules over one quadrant of the universe above the fixed sign of their element. The Aces correspond to the 3 signs of their own element.

Around the outside of the chart are the cards associated with each planet. The cards on the colored planets also have ruling elements. The Fool is air, The Hanged One is water, and Judgement is fire. Earth corresponds to humanity and does not have a specific card association. You can use the Astral Calendar to find cards and planets that correspond to certain important dates in a reading, like birthdays. Please note that the range of dates for each decan are only approximate as they change slightly year to year. There are **many online** resources to find the exact dates for the year you were born.

Another important thing to note is that each numbered minor arcana card has a ruling planet that is different from that of the ruling planet of the zodiac decan it is associated with. For instance, I was born on November 3, so in the second decan of Scorpio which is ruled by Neptune. However, my card is the VI of Cups which is ruled by the Sun. Additionally, if I were to use the calendar to determine my court significator (or card that represents me in a reading) it would be the King of Cups.

There are many connections that can be found between tarot and astrology. You can even look beyond your sun sign and dive into your whole birth chart.

## Reading Tips

Whether you're reading for yourself or someone else, I believe that there is no right or wrong way to approach tarot reading as long as you go in with an open mind, integrity, and a willingness to see the truth.

\*I've chosen to represent the Princess archetype instead of Pages. However, if you prefer to read Pages feel free to restructure the hierarchy.

\*The keywords I've provided for the meaning of each card are merely guidelines to help you get started. Infinite meaning can be found in them depending on the context of a reading and what your intuition tells you.

\*Reading reversals is a personal preference, but I think they add a lot of depth and expansion to a reading. It's important to note that they are not just the opposite of their upright counterparts. They have more to do with how the energy of the card is being expressed. When a card is upright its energy can be fully expressed. When it's reversed that same energy still exists, but it becomes repressed and unable to reach its full potential. You can think of it as an "in progress" state.

In many cases, reversals guide you to look inward for the answers you seek. Imagine a card laying upright before you, then imagine rotating it from its upward to reversed state. The motion creates an inward spiral that points to you.

\* Significators are cards that are sometimes used to represent the querent (or person asking the question) in a reading. They can be chosen randomly, by personal preference, or by referencing your birthdate on the Astral Calendar. Generally, **court cards** are chosen for this purpose because they represent personality archetypes.


\*It's important to be well acquainted with your deck and thoroughly shuffle it before you begin a reading. There is no right or wrong way to do so. Clear your mind and be open to the messages it has for you.

\*Don't just read the cards individually, but read the story they create together.

\*Remember, if you don't like the outcome of your reading, you have the power to change it.

### 3 Card Spreads

These are two great beginner spreads, and my go-tos for when I just want to sit with my cards and do a quick check-in. They may seem simple, but they can be extremely powerful.



### Past, Present, Future

A spread for the year's turning points or times of change in your life.

1. Something to let go of or a lesson to take with you.

2. Something to be grateful for in this moment.

3. Something to look forward to.

### Self Check-in


A spread for when you feel stuck or disconnected from yourself.

1. How am I feeling?

- 2. What do I need?
- 3. What can I do for myself?

## The Compass Spread

A spread for when you're at a crossroads, feel directionless, or need to realign your inner compass.



- 0. Your Significator
- 1. Your Current Situation
- 2. A Direction and Guidance
- 3. An Action to Take
- 4. The Destination


Place a significator in the 0 position face up, then place the cards for position 1 and 2 face down. Lay out the four compass cards for position 3 face down starting with north and go clockwise. Then place the final card face down in position 4. Begin by turning over card 1. This card represents your current situation or the problem at hand that you are trying to solve. Flip card 2. This card will offer guidance for moving forward and tell you which direction to take.

Wands: Go South Cups: Go West Swords: Go East Pentacles: Go North

If a major arcana card appears here, read it, interpret its guidance, and either stop there or draw again for a minor arcana card. Alternatively, you can use your 4 sided die to determine which way to go.

1: South 2: West 3: East 4: North

Next, flip card 3 in the position of the cardinal direction you were told to go. This is the action you should take. The final card in position 4 will represent the destination or outcome of taking the advice of your reading.



One of the keys to happiness is to find stability among the ups and downs of life. Downturns of fate are inevitable, but with awareness you can work to actively stay on the upside of the wheel as much as possible. Use this spread for guidance when you feel like you've lost control of your fate or you fear an impending downward turn.

To begin, pull the Wheel of Fortune from your deck and place it in the center of your reading space, either upright or reversed depending on the current state of your, or your querent's, luck. If you are currently going through hard times, reverse it. If you are feeling lucky but afraid of the impending downturn, keep it upright. The rest of the cards will be placed around the wheel and read either upward or reversed in relation to it, as the numbers are read in the diagram.

Each card relates to one of the 8 Sabbats or the Wheel of the Year.

1. Birth/Rebirth - This position relates to Yule. What will help give you a fresh outlook or perspective? What positive changes can you make to turn the wheel in your favor?

2. Purification - This position relates to Imbolc. What negative force(s) can you remove from your life to improve the outlook of your fortune?

3. Balance - This position relates to Ostara. What is throwing your wheel off balance and what can you do to restore it? 4. Creation/Cultivation - This position relates to Beltane. What can you actively do to improve the outlook of your fortune? What should you focus on cultivating?

5. Turning Point - This position relates to Litha. What will ultimately bring about a shift in your fortune?


6. Reward/Consequence - This position relates to Lammas or Lughnasadh. If you listen to the advice of this reading and your intuition and act on it, what will be the outcome? Conversely, what is the risk of ignoring it?

7. Gratitude - This position relates to Mabon. What are the gifts in your life that can help ground you in gratitude despite the turns of fate?

8. Intuition/Spirituality - This position relates to Samhain. How can your intuition guide the way forward? What is it trying to tell you?

After all the cards are read, circle back to position 1 and readdress the questions it posed.

### The Prism Spread



I designed this spread as a companion to The Prism Tarot. Each card represents the current state of one facet of your personality. Listen to the message it has for you. Ask yourself if you've been neglecting it or overindulging it. How can you strike a balance and paint the picture of your ideal self? It's possible that you're already there, but it's important to check in every so often so you can always keep growing and improving. 0. You may choose to place a significator in the center of the prism before doing the reading.

1. Your grounded, practical, and passive side.

2. Your indulgent, creative, and passionate side.

3. Your confident, brave, and active side.

4. Your loving, emotional, and nurturing side.


5. Your intellectual, honest, and ethical side.

6. Your spiritual/intuitive side.

7. Your highest self and inner wisdom.

# DOMINION

A game of luck, strategy, and intuition for 4 players using The Prism Tarot and a 4-sided die.



- a. Ace of Pentacles
- b. Ace of Cups
- c. Ace of Wands
- d. Ace of Swords
- e. Major Arcana Discard

Set the court cards, minus the Princesses, aside in four face up piles according to suit in this order: Knights on top, then Queens, and Kings. Leave space next to each for the discard piles. Each player gets a Princess card. They can be chosen blindly or by preference. Keep your Princess face up and to the side until you need them. Their suit will dictate the minor arcana cards you should aim to collect and the court cards you need to buy.

Shuffle the deck and deal the rest of the cards. Each player will have 15 cards in their hand plus their Princess.

## How to Play–

Each round has two phases--a **trick** phase and a **turn phase**.

#### Trick Phase

Each round begins with a trick phase in which each player chooses a minor arcana card from their hand and places it face up simultaneously on the table. If you have none in your hand you do not get to participate. Whoever plays the highest number wins the trick and adds the other players' cards to their hand.

In the unlikely event of a power struggle where there are multiple cards of the same value played and no clear victor, each player will draw again. Winner takes all. The winning player must then roll the 4-sided die to determine which princess will take possession of the card(s) that won them the trick. **1=Wands 2=Cups 3=Swords 4=Pentacles** They then take their turn and play

continues clockwise.

### Turn Phase: Trading

Each player gets one turn before the next trick phase. On your turn, you must trade one card of your choice from your hand with one from another player of your choice. The other player must fan their cards out and allow you to choose one blindly. Keep your trade a secret from the other players.

### Buying

After trading, you may buy a single court card that corresponds to the suit of your princess with any minor arcana cards in your hand of the same suit.

Knights cost 2 cards, Queens cost 3 cards, and Kings cost 4 cards. You must buy them in that order and you can only buy one per turn. Cards spent will go into the discard pile next to the court pile of that suit.

Once you possess a court card of your suit you may place it on the Ace, or throne, of your suit on the compass.

### Major Arcana Effects

Major arcana cards each have special effects and abilities. You may use them at the beginning of your turn or during a card trade depending on the effect.

The Prism - Everyone reveals their hands.

The Void - Everyone's hands are reshuffled together and dealt again.

**Elementals** (Judgement, The Hanged One, and The Fool) - The player of your choice has to give you all of the cards they have in the suit of your choice. This counts as your trade for the turn. **Planet Ruled** - Instead of choosing blindly when trading, you may request a single card in the suit of your choice.

**Zodiac Ruled** - When you are chosen for a trade you get to choose the card the player receives from you.

Once you play a major arcana card it must be discarded in the center of the compass, even if the play fails.

#### Throning

Once you successfully buy the Knight, Queen, and King of your suit, you may place your Princess on the Ace, or their throne, to rule their quadrant of the universe. Whoever places a Princess on their throne first wins the game.

#### Capturing

If you take possession of the last card a player has in their hand during the trick phase you also take possession of their Princess. That player is then out of the game. You can win by throning any Princess in your possession. Stay aware of how many cards you have left in your hand.

Pay attention to who wins tricks and where the cards go.

When all else fails, trust your intuition.

#### Inspiration

Tarot has a long history of being used for gameplay. I have an education in game design, so it's a concept I've always been fascinated by and wanted to explore.

I designed this game to tell the story of how the Princess inherits all the energy from their suit and eventually takes their throne. It is a journey of completion from the initial spark and potential of the Ace to the ultimate fulfillment of that potential.

I also wanted to create an experience that would help players internalize the hierarchy of not only the court cards, but the majors and minors as well. The majors have more control over the game while the minors are subject to many twists of fate.
